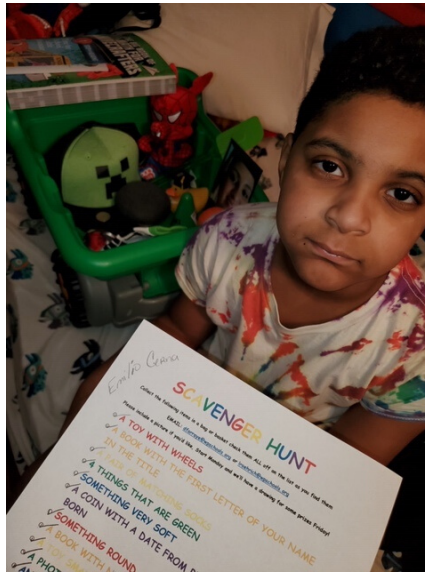
Virtual Field Trips

Model Building



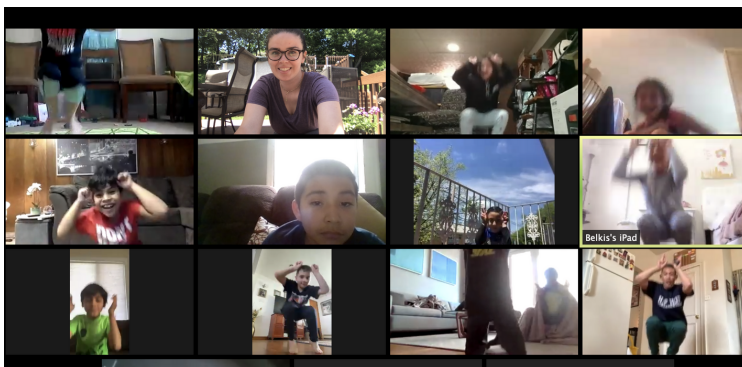

Fairy Tale Character Study



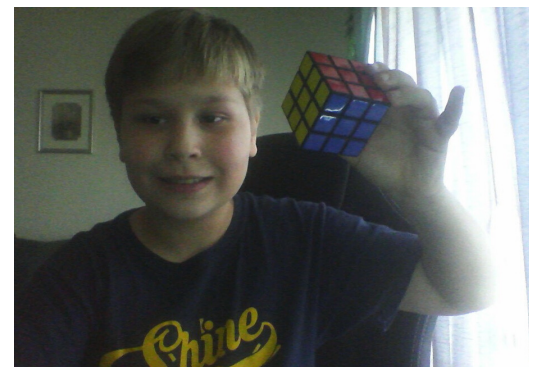

Young Dancers



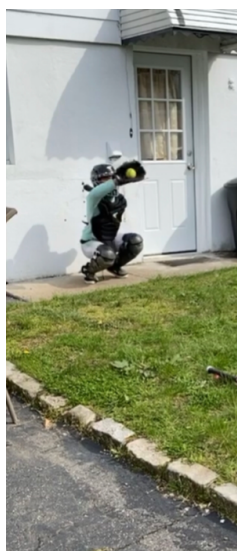
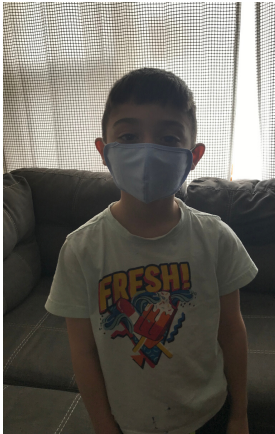
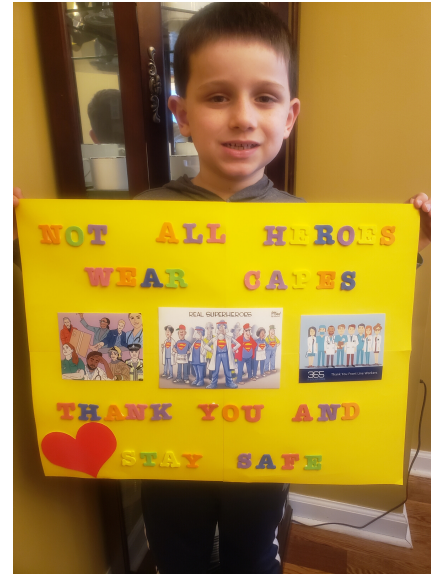
