Memorial School students learn how to be upstanders for animals

Memorial School's Animal Club hosted two special visitors from St. Hubert's Animal Welfare Center on Wednesday - volunteer Karen Potocek and Iris, a rescued 1-year-old pup. Founded in 1939, St. Hubert's Animal Welfare Center, based in Madison, operates five animal shelters and has a nationally renowned Training and Behavior Center.

St. Hubert's provides a variety of services including humane education, a pet food pantry, low-cost spay/neuter program and a professional education series.

Potocek spoke to the students about a variety of different issues on the theme of "Empathy & Compassion - Influencing Your World." She told the students that animal rescue and education is the work of upstanders - not bystanders. She said they could be upstanders for animals as well, by choosing adoption over purchasing, spaying or neutering their pets, being mindful of the businesses they support as well as working to educate others.

Potocek told the students that when it comes to pet adoptions, they have choices - a pet store or adoption. She described life for animals in the puppy mills that breed dogs for pet stores and how they often can lack cleanliness and animals can have poor health and lack of socialization. She encouraged the students to "adopt, don't shop" if their family was going to get a pet. In addition, many small animals purchased from pet stores often wind up being surrendered to shelters such as ferrets, birds, rabbits and reptiles.

Students learned about the importance of spaying and neutering their pets. Potocek detailed how it helps control the pet overpopulation crisis, and helps an animal's overall health and behavior.

Potocek also spoke to the students about the difference between farm animals and factory farm animals, the ones raised for consumption. She noted that factory farm animals are not often treated very well and often live in very poor, crowded conditions.
